More men, less days (Indirect)

$$\therefore x + 8 : x = 60 : 50 \text{ or } \frac{x+8}{x} = \frac{60}{50}$$

$$\text{or, } 50(x + 8) = 60x \text{ or } x = 40.$$

\therefore Number of men in the beginning = 40.

$$\therefore 1 \text{ man's } 1 \text{ day's work} = \frac{1}{216}$$

$$12 \text{ men's } 6 \text{ days' work} = \left(\frac{1}{18} \times 6 \right) = \frac{1}{3}.$$

$$\text{Remaining work} = \left(1 - \frac{1}{3} \right) = \frac{2}{3}.$$

$$16 \text{ men's } 1 \text{ day's work} = \frac{16}{216} = \frac{2}{27}.$$

$$\frac{2}{27} \text{ work is done by them in 1 day.}$$

$$\frac{2}{3} \text{ work is done by them in } \left(\frac{27}{2} \times \frac{2}{3} \right) = 9 \text{ days.}$$
